Vacancy – Community Football Engagement Worker

We are a growing sport for development charity based in Bolton that offer employees the chance to deliver work that makes an impact alongside colleagues who share a mutual passion for improving people's lives and narrowing the gap of disadvantage.

Bolton Wanderers in the Community aims to inspire people and raise aspirations while supporting physical and personal development to create a more active and healthy way of life.

We continue to be an innovative and forward-thinking charity that works in partnership with local, regional and national organisations to achieve the greatest outcome for our beneficiaries.

We are looking to recruit one or more Community Football Engagement Workers on variable hour contracts. The role will likely be for a minimum of 5 hours per week, but could be more dependent on requirement and availability. The hourly rate we are offering is £8.91-£11.50 per hour dependant on experience and qualifications – with the addition of holiday pay.

Requirements:

- Possess the experience and ability to engage with marginalised groups, including under-represented young people such as those with challenging behavior, accessing alternative provision and with additional needs.
- Hold a minimum Level 1 Coaching Award with a recognised NGB or an equivalent Youth Work qualification.
- Have a strong passion and desire to make a positive impact to children and young people's lives through Bolton Wanderers in the Community's work.
- The role will likely involve evening and weekend work.
- Understand the power of the brand of Bolton Wanderers Football Club and how it can help bring about positive change in individual's lives.
- This post is subject to an enhanced DBS and two satisfactory references.

Responsibilities:

- To deliver fully inclusive community sessions to the local community, including to some of the most marginalised groups, including those with challenging behaviour, accessing alternative provision or have additional needs.
- To maintain effective records of work undertaken with beneficiaries for the purpose of monitoring and evaluation. These may include registers, case studies and any other records.
- Liaise with schools, teachers, youth workers and parents when required.
- To represent Bolton Wanderers in the Community at any relevant activities/events.
- Offer excellent service at all times and upholding the professional image of BWFC and BWitC.

The Location: These roles will require delivery at a number of sites across Bolton, so a full clean driving licence and car is preferred.
